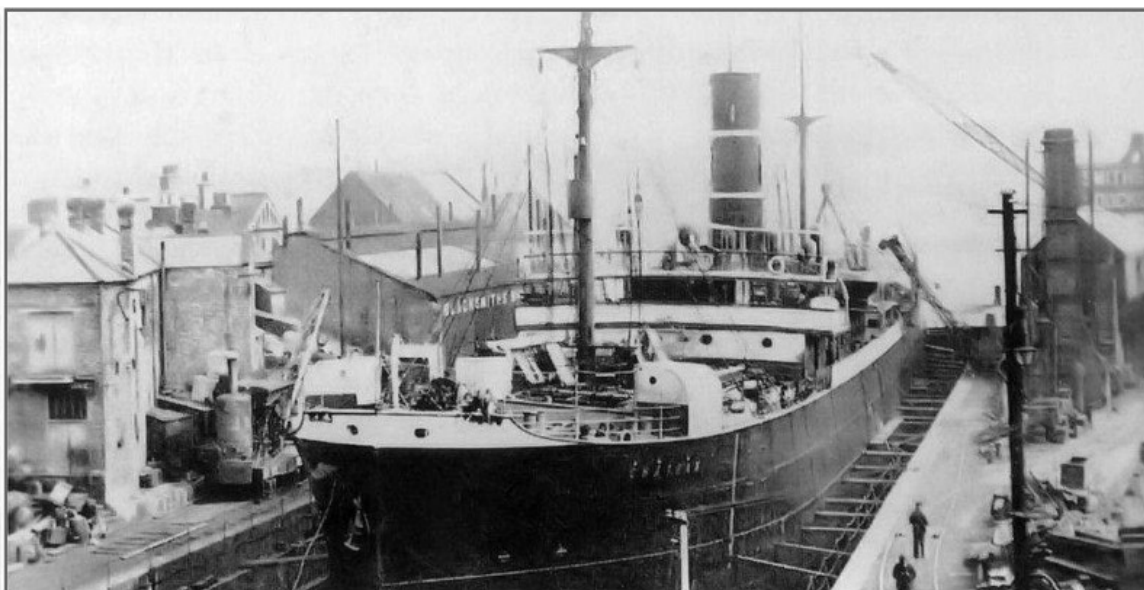
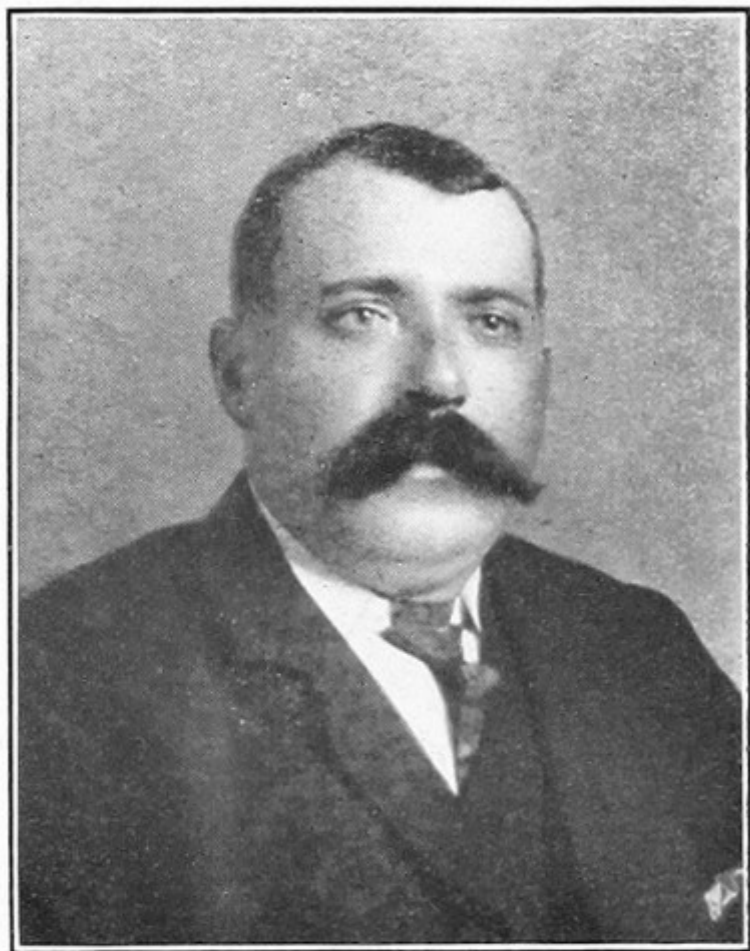


## ANDERSON FAMILY

**Magnus Anderson**, 25<sup>th</sup> January 1869 — 6<sup>th</sup> December 1959, Master Mariner, Catfirth. Served in the 1<sup>st</sup> World War. Magnus was a Master mariner. In 1886 when aboard the "Triune" sealing and whaling, he was caught in the ice, returning on the small craft "Maud", apparently carrying 2 polar bears and an Eskimo. He also joined the "Aurora" and "Active". Later he sailed on a trading brig between Newcastle and the Baltic, then with small steamers to the Black Sea and southern states of America carrying cotton. He was mate on the "Dawar", sister ship of the "Cutty Sark". About 1902, he became a Trinity House pilot, following his profession for 38 years. the Cunard Company employed him for 28 years as pilot and he was regarded as outstanding in a service attracting the best men in the Merchant navy. He piloted both the old and new "Mauretania".

**John Hay Anderson**, born 17<sup>th</sup> July 1875 at Dury North Nesting. Chief Officer, SS *Lindafell*. Drowned by the sinking of his ship in September 1915, aged 40.

Linda Fell SS was a British cargo steamer of 3025grt that sailed from Philadelphia on the 20th September 1915 for Cienfuegos with a cargo of coal and was posted missing.
